Wabash County Council Chairman, Gary Nose, called the meeting to order at 8:00 A.M. in the Circuit Courtroom of the courthouse, with Joann Rauh absent. Leon Ridenour shared a prayer, and minutes of the 1/28 meeting were approved with a correction, moved by Richard Pepple, second by Eugene Schenkel, and passed. The Council Alcoholic Beverage Board appointment is Phillip Mendenhall rather than George Airgood. Chris Martin, WEDCOR director, and Bill Foulke, WEDCOR Board President talked with Council. Chris, as the new director, is working diligently to get things going and carry on some exciting projects started by former director, Bill Bradley. Economic development is slow now, and our area needs to establish good job opportunities and stimulate existing businesses, in an effort to keep our own people and attract new residents. WEDCOR has a committee for attracting new business, a retention and expansion committee to keep businesses here, and a public relations board to keep people informed about what WEDCOR does, and can do. Council discussed the ambulance funding issue at length. They would like funding to come from a source other than county general funds in the future. Ted Little will talk with Hamilton County plus a few other counties to learn how their ambulance services function. Council already knows it's run by the county in Whitley County, and the townships in Kosciusko County. Gary will talk with the Association of Indiana Counties about the possibility of instituting a phone tax or cumulative ambulance fund for financing the ambulance services. He'll also check about the legality of using CEDIT funds for this. Paul Sites, will poll North Manchester residents for their thoughts on the matter. He feels they may not be aware there's concern for continued coverage in their area. The Auditor will advertise for an additional appropriation of \$50,000. for both the City of Wabash and Life-Med for the March Council meeting. Ted wondered if court fees could be increased to the user, as court related expenses are one of the largest drains on county general money. After addressing the additional appropriation ordinance and transfer ordinance, Leon moved to adjourn, second by Rich, and passed.
